Queen Degraphenreid – President North Carolina State Coalition - NCNW

Unaware of the total calling on her life, in 1963 Queen enrolled in Allen University, an AME institution, at a pivotal time in history – the middle of the Civil Rights Movement, the same year of the 1963 March on Washington. God does not give one a vision without a provision. The South Carolina NAACP Office was located directly across the street from Allen University, and would become her "afterschool", under the tutelage of its president, the Rev. I. D. Quincy Newman. Their relationship was classic as the biblical story of Moses and Joshua; and like Joshua, she would "stay the course", learning the voting and civil rights movement to lead and empower her people. She was well pleased with the 2020 voter turnout.



For her diligence, she was inducted as "An Invisible Giant of the Voting Rights Movement" into the National Voting Rights Institute and Museum in Selma, Alabama in 1995, commemorating the 30th Anniversary of the 1965 Voting Rights Amendment (VRA). To date, she has achieved over 57 years in the voter rights movement in four (4) states. Notable accolades include both the "Dr. John Hope Franklin Humanitarian Award" and the "Dr. Dorothy I. Height Humanitarian Award".

Like 1963, 1995 would become another pivotal year. The same year of the induction into the National Voting Right Museum, Queen became the Founding President of the Fayetteville Area Section of the National Council of Negro Women, and which was chartered in 1996 with 114 men and women new members. During this season, she is celebrating both 25th anniversaries. With the encouragement and support of Dr. Dorothy Height, Queen would further become the Organizer of both the Fayetteville Area Youth Section and the Fayetteville State University Collegiate Section. All three (3) sections have maintained their active status with our NCNW Membership Department.

A Life Member of NCNW, Queen's extensive leadership and membership extends over 40 years, and expands three states (Ohio, South Carolina and North Carolina). In addition to serving as the Chartering President of the Fayetteville Area Section, she would serve as FAS President four (4) terms, including the current term. Of equal importance, she is serving her fifth term as President of the North Carolina –National Council of Negro Women, Inc. Her NCNW national leadership experience includes serving on the Nominating and Elections Committees for NCNW National Convention for a total of eight (8) years.

She often says that she is channeling the life of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune. They were both born into large share-cropping families in SC; they both walked 5 miles (both ways) to rural small church schools; they both attended Black church-affiliated colleges; they both became voting rights activists, developed and directed programs for Black youth, members of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.; and leaders in multiple women organizations, but cultivated a passion – the National Council of Negro Women, Inc. And, like Dr. Bethune, Queen would like to leave a legacy of service.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Making a difference in our communities by providing opportunities and support to the following organizations, programs and initiatives:

Health and Wellness

CAS GOAL: To inform our members and the African American community about strategies to prevent and treat breast cancer, heart disease, high blood pressure and other high risk diseases. Annually, we support the Making Strides Against Breast Cancer.

Women's Center

CAS GOAL: Provide clothing, toiletries, food and serving of meals for clients of the Wake County Women's Center.

Loaves and Fishes

CAS GOAL: Supports the after-school program with supplies and other initiatives as requested by the program. Our co-founder initiated this program over 24 years ago. We continue to provide services to children in their program yearly.

Raleigh Rescue Mission

CAS GOAL: Provide gifts, resources, and supplies as requested by the organization. Support the mission's programs including the New Life Plan.

Shirley Sheares A.M.E. Empowerment Center

CAS GOAL: Provides clothing, blankets, gifts, food and serving of meals to the men of the shelter

MATCH: Mothers and Their Children

CAS GOAL: Provide support to children of women incarcerated in Wake County. Program assistance includes visitation support, rides and book drives.

Salvation Army Center

CAS GOAL: Provide encouraging support through one or two planned events on site, e.g. Mommy and Me for Mother's Day and Holiday Toy Drive.

Meals on Wheels

CAS GOAL: Develop and carry out activities for nursing home residents and seniors in the community. Program – Meal on Wheels.

Civic Engagement

CAS GOAL: Informs and participates in local legislative affairs that concern women and families within the community.

Educational Scholarship

CAS GOAL: Provide a yearly scholarship to college student in financial need to attend Bethune Cook University.





NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NEGRO WOMEN, INC. (NCNW)

National History

The National Council of Negro Women, Inc. is a council of national African American women's organization and community-based sections. NCNW was founded in 1935 by Mary McLeod Bethune (1875-1955) who called together 28 national women leaders to form "an organization of organizations – a council." The "council" would represent the concerns of Black women, bring organizations together, and give Black women the opportunity to realize their goals for social justice and human rights through united, constructive action. Today the mission of NCNW is to lead, develop and advocate for women of African descent as they support their families and communities. NCNW fulfills this purpose through research, advocacy, and national and community-based services and program on issues of health, education, and economic empowerment.

CAPITAL AREA SECTION OF NORTH CAROLINA

"Coming Together Is A Beginning, Keeping Together Is Progress, Working Together Is Success" is the motto of the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW) – Capital Area Section (CAS). This motto was the motivation for the vision of founders Christine B. Jones and Frances B. Grant who, in February 1997, established CAS.

Two years later, due to the unrelenting determination and strong leadership of founding members, the Capital Area Section was established. On April 24, 1999, a candlelight charter ceremony was held at Shaw University with 68 members in attendance.

Throughout the years, the CAS has been blessed with many talented, dedicated and committed members who strongly embrace the needs of the community and work to advance the growth of African American women. This has been accomplished through committees and programs, such as Women's Center, Men's Shelter, Loaves and Fishes, Salvation Army, Raleigh Rescue Mission and other national and local service projects.

The Capital Area Section is honored to have sponsored the charter of Shaw University and Saint Augustine's University Collegiate Sections in Raleigh, NC.

Dr. Johnnetta Betsch Cole

Johnnetta Betsch Cole is the Chair and Seventh President of the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW), an organization of over 2 million women of African descent. NCNW's mission is to advocate for and empower Black women, their families and their communities. Dr. Cole is a noted educator, author, speaker and consultant on diversity, equity, accessibility and inclusion in educational institutions, museums and other workplaces.

After receiving a Ph.D. in anthropology, she held teaching positions in anthropology, women's studies, and African American studies at several colleges and universities. Dr. Cole served as President of both historically Black colleges for women in the United States, Spelman College and Bennett College, a distinction she alone holds. She also served as the Director of the Smithsonian National Museum of African Art, as a Principal Consultant at Cook Ross, and as a Senior Consulting Fellow at the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. Dr. Cole currently serves as Special Counsel on Strategic Initiatives at the Baltimore Museum of Art.

She has authored, co-authored and edited several books and numerous articles for scholarly and general audiences. Dr. Cole has received numerous awards, and is the recipient of 70 honorary degrees. Throughout her career and in her published work, speeches, and community service, Johnnetta Betsch Cole consistently addresses racism, sexism, and all other systems of inequality. She is a member of the Links, Inc., Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. and a Life Time Member of the NAACP.



Faith Bynum, cpa, mba

Faith Bynum is the Principal of the accounting firm, Faith Bynum, CPA, PC.

She attended North Carolina Central University, where she earned her Bachelors of Business Administration with a concentration in accounting degree. While at NCCU, Faith pledged the Alpha Chi chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.

In December of 2009, she earned her Masters of Business Administration with a concentration in accounting degree from Baker College. In November 2012, she became a North Carolina licensed Certified Public Accountant. Soon after, she started her practice.

Faith's passion to educate people in finances and entrepreneurship has positioned her to be sought after on various speaking platforms. She wrote a book entitled, "Build Faith in Your Business", as a simple guide for people to understand the beginning stages of starting a business. Faith has also served on numerous governing Boards and was accepted into the 2017 class of the William C. Friday Fellowship for Human Relations. She was also an honoree of the 2020 class of NCCU's 40 Under 40 Alumni Awards.

Faith is a native of Durham, NC. She enjoys being a mother to her 13-year-old daughter, Madison. She has a passion for community and education. Faith yearns to always help others grow and develop their life-long passion and purpose.



Dr. Donna E. Corbett

Nearly two decades ago, Dr. Donna Corbett stepped out on faith, leaving the corporate persona she had established and used her expertise in business, training and modeling to establish Amazing Grace Etiquette. Amazing Grace Etiquette's mission is to provide innovative etiquette education and image and social development instruction to all populations seeking resources to change their lives.

In the twenty-first century, it would normally appear that etiquette is often forgotten and ignored. However, Dr. Corbett has transformed the mindset of children, parents, law enforcement, community-based organizations, colleges, universities, and businesses; broadening the positive influence of etiquette education in the social development of thousands of youth and adults.

As the Executive Director, curriculum developer and lead instructor, she works relentlessly to provide instruction on etiquette and manners, respect, image, communication, anti-bullying, and anger management whereas "girls become ladies and boys become gentlemen." Proudly for the past 16 years, Amazing Grace Etiquette has held yearly Prince and Princess Holiday Tea Party Extravaganzas.

Born in Alamance County, North Carolina, in a community and at a time when African American women were not expected to excel as entrepreneurs, Dr. Corbett overcame that stereotype with her parents' unwavering support. To honor their legacies of promoting excellence through community service, she established the Mary E. Corbett Scholarship Foundation and the B.F. Corbett Leadership Academy. These programs broaden opportunities for youth and community leadership, including the Young Men of Excellence Scholarship Program, the Mary E. Corbett Lady of Etiquette Award, the B.F. Corbett Man of the Year Award, Amazing Grace Etiquette's Small Business of the Year and Entrepreneur of Excellence Awards.

In December 2020, Dr. Corbett published My Little Princess Book of Etiquette, in memory of her mother who died in June. This book mirrors the lessons and values her mother lovingly instilled in her. For the past 10 years, Dr. Corbett has built a solid relationship with the Raleigh Police Department and has received local and state recognition for a Summer Charm School program for at-risk teenage girls.

As an instructor with Wake Technical Community College, she has had the honor to teach hundreds of incarcerated men and women professional and life skills: such as career readiness, success keys, employability skills, anger management, small business management, and professional business etiquette as they transition from prison to society.

In recognition of her selflessness and ingenuity, she has been recognized with over 20 communities, state and regional awards and honors. Dr. Corbett shares her success with a life full of friends and a devoted Board of Directors who share her passion for empowering youth through etiquette instruction.

Dr. Corbett enjoys interior decorating, image consulting, public speaking and motivating and inspiring others to be the best of the best! She is a faithful member of Kimes Chapel Baptist Church in Mebane, NC.



Francis Carter-Lee (1874-1968)

My father's maternal grandmother, and my great-grandmother, Frances Carter, was born in 1874, in rural Copiah County, Mississippi, somewhere 'twixt the towns of Crystal Springs and Hazelhurst. Born only nine years after the end of the Civil War, and 11 years after the Emancipation Proclamation, I don't know for sure, but feel fairly certain that at least one of her parents had been a slave. Frances, at the tender age of 15, married an equally tender-aged young man, 17 year old, James Lee. My great-grandfather. On February 14, 1890, they were blessed with their first child, a girl, whom they named Atha. At the time, they were 18 and 16 year-old parents, just beyond the edge of the Reconstruction, and with the harsh restrictions of Jim Crow rules settling in. As sharecroppers, they stayed in Copiah County, where Atha became the oldest of their 14 children —4 daughters, 10 sons. In the early 1900's like many large sharecropping families, they were lured a bit north to the agriculturally rich Mississippi Delta in the hope of making a better life for their family. They moved up to Rolling Fork/Sharkey Co. MS and lived between there and Grace, MS, thriving and surviving in the cotton-growing, sharecropping world. James "Grandpa Jim", would pass in 1934, leaving Frances a widow. Half of the 14 siblings-7-would escape north to Chicago in the Great Migration; half would stay in the Jim Crow south. Atha, the oldest, turned 19 in 1909 and married a young carpenter from the nearby village of Mayersville, MS, named Joe Weeden, Jr. Atha and Joe were my grandparents. Great-grandmother Frances (Ma' Frances to us) lived until 1968, witnessing 94 years of life, and 5 generations of Lees. Proud to be descended from this pioneering Negro Woman!
