CAS GOAL: Supports the after-school program with supplies and other initiatives as requested by the program. Our co-founder initiated this program over 24 years ago. We continue to provide services to children in their program yearly.

Raleigh Rescue Mission

CAS GOAL: Provide gifts, resources, and supplies as requested by the organization. Support the mission's programs including the New Life Plan.

Shirley Sheares A.M.E. Empowerment

CAS GOAL: Provides gifts, food and serving of meals for clients of the Shirley Shears Men's Empowerment Center.

MATCH: Mothers and Their Children

CAS GOAL: Provide support to children of women incarcerated in Wake County. Program assistance includes visitation support, rides and book drives.

Salvation Army Center

CAS GOAL: Provide encouraging support through one or two planned events on site, e.g. Mommy and Me for Mother's Day.

CAS GOAL: Provide a yearly scholarship to college student in financial need to attend Bethune Cook University.

National Council of Negro Women, Inc. (NCNW)

National History

The National Council of Negro Women, Inc. is a council of national African American women's organizations and community-based sections. NCNW was founded in 1935 by Mary McLeod Bethune (1875-1955) who called together 28 national women leaders to form "an organization of organizations – a council." This "council" would represent the concerns of Black women, bring organizations together, and give Black women the opportunity to realize their goals for social justice and human rights through united, constructive action. Today the mission of NCNW is to lead, develop and advocate for women of African descent as they support their families and communities. NCNW fulfills this purpose through research, advocacy, and national and community-based services and program on issues of health, education, and economic empowerment.

Capital Area Section of North Carolina - History

"Coming Together Is A Beginning, Keeping Together Is Progress, Working Together Is Success" is the motto of the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW)–Capital Area Section (CAS). This motto was the motivation for the vision of founders **Christine B. Jones and Frances B. Grant** who, in February 1997, established CAS.

Two years later, due to the unrelenting determination and strong leadership of founding members, the Capital Area Section was established. On April 24, 1999, a candlelight charter ceremony was held at Shaw University with 68 members in attendance.

We are proud to be celebrating our 25th anniversary and service to the community. Throughout the years, CAS has been blessed with many talented, dedicated and committed members who strongly embrace the needs of the community and work to advance the growth of African American women. This has been accomplished through committees and programs, such as Women's Center, Loaves and Fishes, and Raleigh Rescue Mission as well as other service projects.

The Capital Area Section is honored to have sponsored the charter of Shaw University and Saint Augustine's University Collegiate Sections in Raleigh, NC.

Dr. Karrie G. Dixon

Dr. Karrie G. Dixon was named 12th CEO and seventh Chancellor of Elizabeth City State University (ECSU) (N.C.) on Dec. 14, 2018. She previously served as interim chancellor since April 9, 2018. Prior to this appointment, Dixon was a senior administrator at the University of North Carolina System Office since 2008. She was promoted to serve as vice president for academic and student affairs as well as chief student affairs officer, where she oversaw and shaped systemwide policy to ensure overall success for the more than 220,000 students enrolled across the state. Prior to joining the UNC System, Dixon served a total of 10 years combined at two other UNC campuses.

Since Dr. Dixon's arrival at ECSU, enrollment has climbed nearly 40% in just 18 months and degree program offerings expanded, which included launching an unmanned aircraft systems degree program, an online master's degree in education, and an online bachelor's degree in homeland security. Under her leadership, the university increased its fleet from two to 12 aircraft for ECSU's signature aviation program.

In 2019, North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper awarded Dr. Dixon The Old North State Award, one of the highest honors granted by the State of North Carolina, which is awarded to "individuals who have shown dedication and service beyond expectation and excellence to the Great State of North Carolina." She also was named by the HBCU Campaign Fund, as one of "The Ten Most Dominant HBCU Leaders of 2020."

Dr. Dixon serves on various local and national boards, to include: the Board of Directors for the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, the Association of Governing Boards Council of Presidents and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges Board of Trustees. In 2020, Dr. Dixon was named to the newly formed national Women in Aviation Advisory (WIAAB) board by U.S. Dept. of Transportation Secretary, Elaine L. Chao. Dr. Dixon serves as a presidential sponsor for the North Carolina American Council on Education Women's Network.

Dr. Dixon holds a bachelor's degree from NC State University, a master's degree from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and a doctorate from NC State. She and her husband Devi have two daughters.

Wellness Champion



Stephanie Bullock-Allen

Mrs. Stephanie Bullock-Allen resides in Raleigh, NC and has lived there since a small child. She enjoys providing health, fitness and wellness information to those in the community. Stephanie participated on organized sport teams in grade school and a student athlete at the collegiate level. This lifestyle encouraged young people to participate in a physical activity or sport and helps manage stress, tension, reduces obesity, assist over active children and offers social interaction to help develop people skills.

On her own time, Stephanie has worked with children in lower economic neighborhoods bringing balls and games to the playgrounds. She has also volunteered to work with schools providing support and supervising stations.

Mrs. Bullock-Allen is a graduate of North Carolina Central University where she obtained her undergraduate degree in Therapeutic Recreation and a Master's of Science degree in Recreational Management. Early in her career, she served Durham as a Leisure Service Specialist with the City of Park and Recreation Department. This powerful job introduced her to the importance of daily recreation and physical activity which promotes a healthy lifestyle. This is where she found her love for teaching and leading fitness and aerobics classes of all ages. With the federal government, she managed a corporate fitness center for the National Institutes of Environmental Health Sciences. She was hired as an Adjunct Professor at NCCU in the Physical Education, Dance and Recreation Department. Mrs. Bullock-Allen also taught academic fitness classes, volleyball, racquetball and beginning and intermediate swimming.

Stephanie currently works at North Carolina State University in the Health and Exercise Studies Department. She continues to educate and bring awareness of personal health to each of her students and challenges them to see their physical potential.

Stephanie is a personal trainer and exercise enthusiast who teaches exercises classes at churches and several different fitness facilities for over several years. Her goal is to help individuals keep their God given vessels working and functioning sufficiently and properly well into the mature years.

Stephanie is truly a Wellness Champion as her passion impacts the fitness/nutrition/mental health of the citizens in the community and supports their future. She earned an MBA in Global Management from the University of Phoenix -Raleigh Campus. She combined her passion and profession together when she received her Doctor of Ministry in Creative Arts from the Graduate Theological Foundation. Dr. McFarland is also a rising music ministry consultant/strategist, adjunct professor and author in the African American Worship Experience. She has over 20 years of music ministry experience in utilizing her skills in area churches.

She has leveraged her community connections & civic relationships to partner with other organizations such as: Hymns for Him, Inc. – organization dedicated to preserving & celebrating hymns. At the Garner Road Community Center, for the past 5 years, she has taken part in the annual youth college, and career & health fair.

Due to the loss of her mother at a young age, she launched an educational endowment fund at Benedict College in Columbia, SC and honors her father after his loss in July 2020.

Dr. McFarland embodies the spirit of the Women of Excellence Award in the STEAM category through her community service and her career.

Attorney Morton is actively licensed to practice law in the states of North Carolina and Georgia. A Raleigh native and graduate of Wake Forest University School of Law, Attorney Morton is passionate about helping her clients navigate their way through the legal process. At Wake Forest University, Attorney Morton was editor of the Intellectual Property Law Journal, a Legal Research and Writing Teaching Assistant, a member of the Frederick Douglass Moot Court Team, and Secretary /Treasurer of the Honor Council.

Prior to attending Wake Forest University School of Law, Attorney Morton earned a BSBA in Business Administration of Law from Western Carolina University. In May 2003, Attorney Morton was the only African-American to graduate with honors from the University's Honor's College. While at Western, Attorney Morton held numerous leadership positions in social, civic, and honors organizations.

Since opening her firm in 2010, Attorney Morton has represented her clients throughout Eastern North Carolina. She has used her position as an attorney to advocate for equal access to the court system by all persons, regardless of race, gender, or socioeconomic status. Attorney Morton is also a staunch advocate of equal treatment for all attorneys of color.

Attorney Morton serves on the Boards of Miller Motte's Paralegal Advisory Committee and Passage Home, Inc. In 2020, she was appointed to Passage Home, Inc.'s Executive Council by the CEO and is currently the only person of color on the Council. Attorney Morton believes that representation matters, and she understands the importance of advocating, even if it means doing so alone, for her community.

She has served on the Leadership Council for the Junior League of Raleigh since 2016. Since 2015, she has been actively involved in her daughter's school. Simultaneously, Attorney Morton devotes countless hours to her sorority, where she serves as President of the local chapter (Omicron Zeta), Legal Counsel for North Carolina, and serves on the International Legal Advisory Council of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.

When asked how she has time to run a business, serve the community, and pour into her daughter, Madisen, Attorney Morton often reflects upon one of Dr. Martin Luther King's quotes: "We must use time creatively, and forever realize that the time is always ripe to do right."
